Tenets of Faith

Section 1: We believe the Bible is given by inspiration of God and is infallible, absolutely supreme, and is our all-sufficient rule for faith and practice. (II Tim. 3:16-17).

Section 2: We believe that Jesus Christ came into the world to reveal the Father and was the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and that Jesus Christ was the Creator of all things, for by Him the worlds were made. We further believe that in Christ dwelt all the fullness of the God head bodily, and it is impossible to know the Father without knowing the Son. (John 14; Heb. 1: Col. 2).

Section 3: We believe the one true God has revealed Himself as the eternally self-existent "I AM", and has further revealed Himself as embodying the principles of relationship and association; i.e., as Father, Son and Holy Ghost. (Deut. 6:4; Mark 12:29; Is. 43:10).

Section 4: We acknowledge the Lordship of Jesus Christ over all things in heaven and in earth and under the earth. (Phil. 2:9,10).

Section 5: We believe that man, by transgression, fell from a state of righteousness and holiness in which he was first created, into a state of death in trespasses and sins, in which he is held a slave of sin and an enemy of God until he is delivered by the power of the Gospel. (Rom. 4:12-21).

Section 6: We believe that each believer must lay a foundation of Biblical truth and experience upon which he builds his life. These foundation stones are repentance from dead works, faith toward God, baptisms, laying on of hands, resurrection of the dead and eternal judgment. (Heb. 6:1,2).

Section 7: We believe that repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ produces the work of justification in the believer. Through faith in the shed Blood of Christ, the believer is brought on to the grounds of the New Covenant and made a partaker in the death of Jesus Christ, and is therefore born again. (John 3:3; Rom. 5:1-9; Luke 22:20).

Section 8: We believe that Water Baptism is an essential and necessary step for an obedient born again believer, and is to be performed only upon repentant believers. (Acts2:38). This is to be done by immersion, and we further believe that it is the means whereby we receive the Covenant Seal of Circumcision upon the heart. (Col. 2:2-13). Water Baptism is to be administered only to believers who are old enough to completely understand God's plan of redemption.

Section 9: We believe that the baptism of the Holy Spirit is a gift to be received by all believers. (Acts 2: 4 & 38). We believe that the speaking in tongues, as the Spirit gives utterance, is the scriptural physical sign which accompanies the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

Section 10: We believe that each believer should speak in tongues and then covet to prophesy so that he might edify the whole church. (1 Cor. 14:1-5). We further believe that prophecy in the church is a sign of the end time visitation of God (Joel; Acts 1), for the "testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy". (Rev. 19:10).

Section 11: We believe in the doctrine of the laying on of hands for:

1. The confirmation of ministries by the laying on of hands, (Acts 13:1,3).
2. The impartation of the gift of the Holy Ghost (Acts 8:17,18).
3. The ministry of healing the sick (Mark 16:16).
4. The blessing and dedication (setting apart) of children (Mark 10:16).

Section 12: We believe in the five fold ministry given to the church at the ascension of Jesus Christ, and that this continues to be needed and should be expected today; the ministries of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers. Working with these ministries will be elders, deacons, and the gifted men and women of the church.

Section 13: We believe that "by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; ... not of works lest anyone should boast". (Eph. 2:8,9). We further believe that the emphasis for a continuous walk in grace should be upon heart righteousness and purity, and not on a particular custom of outward dress or adornment. (1 Pet. 3:3).

Section 14: We believe that the nine gifts of the Spirit (1 Cor. 12), should be and must be operative in the church today in order for the church to enjoy the fullness of God; also, that these gifts are imparted by the sovereignty of the Holy Spirit and only work or are operated by this one and selfsame Spirit. (1 Cor. 12:11).

Section 15: We believe that we are one Body, being members one with another, and that the basis of our fellowship is in Christ in the power of the Spirit. (Eph. 2:13-22; 4:3-6).

Section 16: We hold that healing for the Body is provided in the sacrificial death of our Lord Jesus Christ, for "by His stripes we are healed". (1 Pet. 2:24, 25).

Section 17: We believe "that the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made (us) free from the curse of sin, sickness and death. (Rom. 8:2; Matt. 8:18).

Section 18: We believe that the mystery and hope of the church is "Christ in you" and that we can expect to be totally transformed into His image. (Col. 1:26, 27; Rom. 8:21).

Section 19: We believe in the personal return of our Lord Jesus Christ at His second advent (coming). (Matt. 24:42-44; Acts 1:11).

Section 20: We believe in the Resurrection of those who have fallen asleep in Christ and their translation together with those that are alive and remain until the coming our Lord. (1 Thess. 4:16-18; Rom. 8:23; Titus 2:1).

Section 21: We believe that "the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death." (Rev. 21:8).

Section 22: We believe that there will be "a new heaven and a new earth, in which righteousness dwells." (2 Pet. 3:13)

We would like to particularly thank the Executive Board who made very big decisions over the last couple of years. With their support and wisdom, we are now on the verge of constructing our new church. This is not a small undertaking, it is a very large and involved project. On behalf of TCC, a very big thank you to each of them for their commitment to the church.

Our church has been maintaining the same size for several years now. We know that this season is coming to an end and we are stepping into a whole new stage that God has prepared for us. Are you ready? We are! Let's serve God in a big way in 2010!

Finance & Audit Report

TCC has been blessed in its finances through the faithful giving of its members over the entire history of our church. We have, through the favor of God, accomplished great things in Toronto. We paid off our first church building at 455 Huron Street in a few short years and were able, through its sale, to purchase our new property at 36 Curity Avenue completely mortgage free.

In the past year the Church Board has focused a lot of attention on details of the new church property, from working through issues with the City to the actual planning of our new facility. TCC is blessed to have a great number of professionals within the church who have given of their time to assist the board in decision making. Through this effort we are now in position to begin construction of Phase Two of our facility.

Here are some interesting numbers for your perusal:

2008 Weekly Average General Income - \$11,990

2009 Weekly Average General Income - \$13,370

Vision 2010 Income for 2009 \$766,496.00, and since inception of the campaign, 2006-2009 - \$1,377,820.00

We have reached the \$927,000.00 mark towards our goal of \$960,000.00 to begin construction on the second phase of our new facility.

We anticipate that the coming year will see the fulfillment of plans to establish TCC in our new facility and provide a wonderful place of worship and service for the people of TCC and the entire community.

The Board of TCC is tremendously blessed to serve with the leadership of the church, supported by the faithfulness of volunteers and each and every member of the church. We continue to be thankful for your prayer support and advice as we serve in the coming year.

Kids Church

At TCC, we have a great Kids Church program for children ages 4 months to 12 years. Our desire is to care for each child and help them grow in their relationship with Jesus and others. We have a variety of activities for the children such as Kids Church Praise & Worship on Sunday mornings, weekly Bible teachings, games and annual events such as Vacation Bible School (VBS) and our Kids Church Fall Festival which takes place at the end of October.

We have a team of 41 people which consist of various leaders, parents, youth and ministry volunteers from our congregation. Each of our ministry volunteers has undergone specific training, a personal interview and reference checks to ensure our children's safety remains a priority.

This year, we are praying and believing for more people to make a difference in the lives of our children, by joining this rewarding ministry. Our KC ministry is continuously growing and will continue to do so as more families come to Christ. Our future facility has been designed to meet the needs of our children.

At Toronto City Church, we value and believe in our kids! They are the future of this nation; let's continue to make a difference in the lives of our children!

2009 Statistics

- 103 children attending our program with an average attendance of 70 kids per Sunday.
 - 17 Nursery, 21 Toddlers, 21 Pre-school, 22 Elementary One, 15 Elementary Two and 6 Pre-Teens.
- 41 Ministry Volunteers
 - 16 Nursery, 7 Toddlers, 7 Pre-school, 4 Elementary One, 4 Elementary Two and 3 Pre-teens.

Goals Accomplished

- We completed our team of coordinators, one for each grade.
- We were able to identify and correct issues we had with the Parent Pager process and parents are now more comfortable with it.

- Certify volunteers in CPR.
- Schedule personal interviews with each ministry volunteer.
- Develop a dance team for special presentations.
- Increase the number of ministry volunteers by 10%.
- Design a tracking system for the general attendance of each child.

Ministry of Helps

The Ministry of Helps consists of a large group of volunteers serving in key areas in the church. Our ministry volunteers aid us in doing the work of the ministry behind the scenes, and in some ministries reflect the *face of the church*; welcoming and serving people during our special/weekly services, conferences and special events.

The Ministry of Helps teams range from Ushering, Greeting, Registration, Hospitality, Bookstore, Stage Crew/Sound & Lighting, Transportation Services, Counting, Cleaning and Communion Preparation/Servers, Media and Translation.

Last year the Ministry of Helps volunteers participated in serving our congregation at over 85 events, various meetings, conferences and services.

Route 412 is the youth ministry of Toronto city church. Our heart for the young people is that they won't give up, but they will grow and mature in the calling that God has placed in their heart. We want to see our young people stand and say that they will "fight the good fight of faith". The passion in our hearts is that they will not be lukewarm Christians, but they will be "hot" for Jesus, that they will lay down their way and embrace the Lord's way.

Our vision is "to provoke young people to live a life of integrity and purpose for our Lord Jesus, so that in turn they will ignite that same passion in the lives of all people within their reach." Route 412 is based on the following six core values: Faith, Purpose, Respect, Integrity, Relationship and Excellence. Its name and vision are based on 1 Timothy 4:12 "Don't let anyone make fun of you, just because you are young. Set an example for other followers by what you say and do, as well as by your love, faith and purity." (Contemporary English Version)

Route 412 meets on Tuesday nights for a time of worship, teaching and a variety of fun games and activities. In 2009 we planned various activities where the youth met for a social time, outside of our regular Tuesday night meetings. Some of these events included: BBQ's, Games Nights (Volley Ball, Bowling), Movie Nights, Girls Nights and we organized a trip to Wasaga Beach. The youth participated in some of our major events, such as our camping trip at Deer Lake and "Acquire the Fire" conference which took place in Hamilton.

Apostolic Missions

Pastors Paul & Elaine Yuke

Apostolic Missions is a vital ministry which utilizes the wisdom and experience of seasoned pastors to resource, assist and “come alongside” pastors, leaders and churches/ministries locally, provincially, nationally and abroad.

Positionally, Pastor Paul serves as National Apostolic Facilitator and a Director of Open Bible Faith Fellowship, and as the Canadian Board Member of Church Growth International. In addition, many pastors and leaders in the Greater Toronto Area and provincially, in Ontario and Quebec, look to us for assistance and pastoral covering.

The scope of this ministry includes not only the ministry at other locations, but a lot of time on the phone and by email counseling, encouraging, motivating, problem solving and giving advice. It also involves many hours spent in intercession on others' behalf. As well, there is a good amount of time directed to networking with other ministry organizations/individuals in an ongoing effort to strengthen the Body of Christ so that it can have a stronger, more unified impact for the cause of Christ.

Here is a brief overview of the types of activities we do:

- Visiting churches, some more than once and some several times
- Meet with/ resource pastors and leaders of organizations
- In addition to the above we do Encounters, OBFF Growth Days for pastors, serve at conferences, funerals of ministers, OBFF Director Meetings, CGI Board Meetings, conduct OBFF membership interviews, attend City prayer meetings, attend/resource outside events, etc.
- All expenses for these activities, including transportation expenses, come out of the Apostolic Missions Fund. There are four churches that send monthly cheques to assist with these expenses. In addition, OBFF refunds travel expenses for OBFF – related activities. On some occasions, ministries will reimburse TCC for travel expenses, but many of them are unable to do so for financial reasons.

In 2010, we continue to make ourselves available to anyone who needs assistance. In 2009, we were assigned a large OBFF zone to oversee, with around 100 members. Over the last year this has become the fastest growing zone in Canada. Everywhere we go, we find leaders that are open and appreciative of the input of “spiritual fathers and mothers” who have already faced and overcome many of the challenges they are now encountering.

Last summer, we once again met with over 50 leaders of national, spirit-filled organizations/fellowships/denominations from across Canada to address common challenges, share vision, pray, and bond in common fellowship, as we work together in Canada as ONE body in Christ.

Last year, we were asked by other senior apostolic leaders in the city to convene ongoing meetings for the purpose of sharing and prayer for our city. The first meeting was held, May 19th, 2009. We have continued to meet monthly, whenever possible, and our relationships have been deeply strengthened. Recently, the GTA ministerial association requested that we serve as apostolic covering for the GTA region churches; to impart vision, stand in the gap for and guard over the pastors/churches within the GTA, impart God's plans for the city, motivate, exhort and encourage. Please pray for us as we enter into this area of ministry. God is bringing forth the ministry office of the apostle all over the earth. Our desire is that His will be done in our city, our province and our nation, as it is throughout the earth!

Our desire is to finish our race strong, doing all we can do for the Lord and His church, to advance the Kingdom of God, and see multitudes saved and discipled. To God be the glory!

Global Harvest Ministries

Evangelist Mark Davy - London, Ontario

Mark Davy is the founder and president of Global Harvest Ministries International (GHMI). His mission focus is the Islamic nations of North Africa and the Middle East where he travels several times a year holding mass crusades and demonstrating the power of God through signs, wonders and miracles.

Operation Philip is a missionary outreach which Mark conducts with an apostolic team of African pastors. They travel into towns where there is no Christian church or where city wide evangelism has never taken place. In 2008 the Operation Philip team drove into Wau, Sudan where there were only 3 believers. During that time 47,000 people received Christ as Mark preached at the foot of a Mosque. Today, there are 9 Christian churches functioning there. In 2009 Operation Philip went to Awiel, Sudan to hold a mass crusade. During the day the team evangelized the neighbouring town of Aquim, helping a pastor with a church of 80 people. One year later, in May 2010, while conducting Operation Philip in Sudan, Mark visited this pastor in Aquim and found that the same church has grown to 3000 people strong. The pastor attributes this growth directly to Operation Philip.

Global Harvest Ministries is networking with other evangelical groups to set up training centers for pastors moving into areas where Operation Philip has held crusades.

Over the past 10 years Mark has seen 1.6 million people receive salvation, many of these being Muslim. In 2009 GHMI recorded 287,000 salvations.

In Canada, Mark evangelizes through Tent Meetings as well as preaching in churches. His message focus is on the empowerment of the believer to do the works of Christ.

Good News Ministries

Rev. Mauro Girgenti – Verona, Italy

Rev. Mauro Girgenti was saved and filled with the Holy Spirit in April of 1977. He sensed the call of God on his life and in 1981 he attended Bible school. After he graduated, he served as assistant pastor at a church in Mississauga (Ontario). India Full Gospel Bible College

India Full Gospel Bible College is located in Kolar Gold Fields, Karnataka, South India. Pastor Monovah Nickelson is the president of the Bible College. The Bible School was established in 1989 under the direction and leadership of Rock Church, Halifax, NS.

To date, nearly 800 students have gone through 1 – 3 year training programs and graduated. Many have been released into full time ministry and have planted churches and ministries all over the nation of India. This past year there were 25 local Indian men who graduated and will be released in various parts of their country. Many of the students who come to the school for training have been cast out of their Hindu families because of their choice to serve the Lord Jesus.

Moriah Orphanage

The Moriah Orphanage accommodates orphans, semi-orphans and poor children of laborers and quarry workers. The orphanages are located in the cities of Krishnagiri and Coimbatore in the state of Tamil Nadu, and Bangalore in the state of Karnataka.

The children in these orphanages are given food/clothing, shelter and education. They are studying in the nearby schools and are given tutoring in the evening. The children are trained in various extra curricular activities like singing, dancing and handwork. Once in a while, they are taken on picnics to enjoy the beauty of nature. Good discipline is maintained in the orphanages based on spiritual concepts. Rev. Dr. Monovah Nickelson is the Co-ordinator of Moriah Orphanages.

Joint Aid Management

Joint Aid Management (JAM) is a South African, registered, non-profit, Christian humanitarian relief and development organization with 25 years of experience in relief and sustainable development.

JAM's programmes focus on nutritional feeding, school feeding, assistance to orphans and vulnerable children, the provision of water and sanitation, as well as skills development, community training on agricultural development, income generation projects and HIV/AIDS programming.

JAM strongly believes that without education, there can be no development. Effective education is only attained through the quality of schooling and most importantly, adequate nutrition which allows a child to effectively focus, retain and apply what is being learned. JAM currently assists more than 498,000 children through nutritional feeding programmes, health and social welfare programmes.

Teen Challenge is a 12-month, faith-based, residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation program that is part of a network of over 15 Teen Challenge Centres across Canada, and more than 1,000 worldwide. The program has a strong faith-based approach and offers spiritual, academic and vocational training that helps equip individuals to return to society as responsible citizens.
